Intent

PSHE in our Curriculum encourages children to appreciate British Values through tolerance, mutual respect and kindness in order to create a supportive, nurturing environment building positivity and self-esteem. It will ensure that each of our pupils will know more, remember more and understand more about how to play a positive role within our society, both as a child and as an adult within the future. We want our children to have high aspirations, a belief in themselves and realise that anything is possible if they put their mind to it. Through their understanding of PSHE, children will be able to succeed in many different areas of the curriculum and throughout life as the learned skills are transferrable. We believe that PSHE plays a vital part of primary education.

Implementation

All Pupils will follow the Cambridgeshire Primary Personal Development Programme appropriate to age, encompassing relevant themes – Myself and My Relationships, Citizenship, Healthy Lifestyles, Economic Wellbeing, SRE and an understanding and appreciation of diversity and differences. The children will meet these themes throughout the course of the year and the themes are built upon as the children move through the school.

In addition to this, PSHE is will also be taught within other subject areas and as part of the creative curriculum through class topics. PSHE is also to be addressed on a daily basis as questions and incidents arise. At times, teachers may choose to hold a circle-time session in response to a particular event or issue. Whole school and key stage assemblies will provide extra opportunities to enhance pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development, promoting our school's values and celebrating achievement. The importance of British Values and inclusion will be embedded throughout school life. Our links with more diverse areas, such as the cities of Leicester and Derby will assist our PSHE curriculum and promotion of BritishValues.

Children will be able to approach a range of real life situations and apply their skills and attributes to help navigate themselves through modern life.
